Bob retired from logging in 1988 and from ranching a few years later. Throughout their long ranching career they hired

a number of interesting and colorful individuals, people we will always remember with either fondness, awe or disbelief! The ranch was a lovely setting for many family gatherings. Bob and Betty were always open to new adventures and developed a keen interest in holistic medicine and alternative healing methods. In their later years they led a quieter life, enjoying visits with friends and family. Bob was still able to can 100 quarts of peaches last summer! He was a devoted caregiver to his wife, Betty, for many years. Bob's greatest joy was spending time with his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He was so proud of all their accomplishments and, in turn, they loved their "Bump" dearly. In his eyes, they could do no wrong!

Bob was predeceased by his son Clarke in 2015 and his brothers Wilf and Jack in 2019.
