

David Smallbone Dies at Princeton

PRINCETON, Sept. 23.—His dearest wish was to serve with the Canadian active forces overseas. Three times he enlisted, only to be discharged on medical grounds.

Still fretting over his bad luck, David Lloyd Smallbone—known also as Lloyd Cooper—died at his residence at Princeton last week. He was 28.

He is survived by his wife in Victoria and his mother, Mrs. E. J. Rotherham, of Princeton.

Born in Princeton on July 6, 1913, Lloyd grew up in the valley, attended school there.

He was a member of the Elks Lodge and funeral services were held under auspices of the Elks and the Canadian Legion of St. Paul's United Church.

Rev. J. C. Goodfellow officiated and interment followed in the family plot.
